HISTORIC AGREEMENT: DG SHIPPING AND ITF JOIN FORCES TO BOOST SEAFARER WELLNESS

emorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed on 07.01.2025 at DG Shipping, Mumbai between Directorate General of Shipping (DGS), India and International Transport Workers Federation (ITWF), UK a democratic, affiliate-led federation recognised as the world's leading transport authority to foster and collaborate best practices, promote mental health management and well-being of seafarers.



CONTAINER SHIP ORDER BOOK HITS NEW RECORD HIGH OF 8.3M TEU

At the end of 2024, the container ship order book was 8.3m TEU, a new record compared with the previous high of 7.8m TEU in early 2023," says Niels Rasmussen, Chief Shipping Analyst at BIMCO.

As 4.4m TEU were contracted during 2024, the second highest ever, the order book grew despite deliveries hitting a new record high of 2.9m TEU. "Making up 92% of the order book capacity, ships 8k TEU or larger dominate the order book. The largest segment, 12-17k TEU, makes up 46% of the order book capacity," says Rasmussen.

Shipyards in China have benefitted the most from the last four years' contracting boom and currently hold 72% of the order book's 8.3m TEU while South Korean and Japanese shipyards hold 22% and 5% respectively.

Liner operators control 79% of the order book capacity, significantly higher than the 61% they control of the fleet capacity. Having already increased from 56% at the beginning of 2019, liner operators' share of fleet capacity is therefore set to continue growing in the coming years.

Though five ships have already been contracted for delivery in 2030, 99% of the order book will be delivered during 2025-2029. According to the current delivery schedule, 0.7m TEU will be

delivered in 2029 while an average of 1.9m TEU will be delivered during 2025-2028, peaking at 2.2m TEU in 2027.

As recycling of ships during the past four years has been limited to 166 ships and 256k TEU, the average age of the fleet has increased 1.4 years since the beginning of 2020. Consequently, the number of ships 20 years old or older has risen, and they now make up 3.4m TEU equal to 11% of the fleet.

If all ships 20 years old or older are recycled during the next five years, the fleet will grow to 35.8m TEU by end 2029, assuming no more ships are contracted for delivery before 2030. That is equal to 16% growth or average annual growth of 3%. The segments smaller than 8k TEU would see an average annual contraction of 4% while the segments 8k TEU or larger would grow on average 7% per year.

"It would require 680k TEU per year to recycle all ships 20 years old or older during the next five years (the current annual record is 657k TEU) but actual recycling is likely to end lower. As long as ships cannot fully return to the Red Sea, recycling will likely continue to be low and at the same time the smaller ship segments tend to be recycled later than average. Therefore, average annual fleet growth during the next five years could end higher than 3%," says Rasmussen.

NAVIG8 ANNOUNCES COMPLETION OF 80% ACQUISITION BY ADNOC L&S FOR \$1.04 BILLION

avig8 TopCo Holdings Inc. announced that it has been acquired by ADNOC Logistics and Services plc (ADNOC L&S), a global leader in energy maritime logistics.

Navig8 is an international shipping pool operator and commercial management company with a modern owned fleet of 32 tankers and a presence in 15 cities across five continents. The Navig8 Group also holds investments in technical management companies, a marine fuels provider operating in over a thousand

ports worldwide, and other enterprises serving the marine sector.

This deal represents a significant milestone for the Company, founded in 2007 as a private organisation by former traders Gary Brocklesby and Nicholas Busch. The acquisition is set to deliver value to both Navig8 and ADNOC L&S' clients and shareholders, fostering opportunities for commercial growth and entry into new markets.

Financial Highlights

Agreement terms: ADNOC L&S has acquired 80% of Navig8 for \$1.04 billion (AED3.8 billion), with economic ownership effective from January 1, 2024. ADNOC L&S will acquire the remaining 20% ownership in mid-2027, for deferred consideration of between \$335 million and \$450 million (AED1.2 billion to AED1.7 billion), dependent on EBITDA delivery ad-interim, payable at that time.

GLOBAL CRUDE EXPORTS DIP AS TRADE ROUTES RESHUFFLE AGAIN

he volume of global crude exports in 2024 declined 2%, the first fall since the COVID-19 pandemic, shipping data showed, due to weak demand growth and as refinery and pipeline changes reshuffled trade routes.

Global crude flows have been roiled for a second year by war in Ukraine and the Middle East, with tanker shipments rerouted and suppliers and buyers split into regions. Middle East oil exports to Europe declined and more U.S. oil and South American oil went to Europe. Russian oil that formerly went to Europe has been redirected to India and China.

These shifts have become more pronounced as oil refineries have shut in Europe amid continued attacks on Red Sea shipping. Middle Eastern crude exports to Europe tumbled 22% in 2024, ship tracking data from researcher Kpler showed. The shift in oil flows "is creating opportunistic alliances," said Adi Imsirovic, an energy consultant and former oil trader, citing closer relationships between Russia and India, China and Iran that are reshaping oil trade.

"Oil is no longer flowing along the least cost curve, and the first consequence is tight shipping, which raises freight prices and eventually cuts into refining margins," said Imsirovic. The U.S. with its surging shale production has been a winner in the global oil trade. The country exports 4 million barrels per day, boosting its share of global oil trade to 9.5%, behind Saudi Arabia and Russia. Trade routes have also been reshuffled by startup of the massive Dangote oil refinery in Nigeria, expansion of Canada's Trans Mountain pipeline to the country's west coast, falling oil output in Mexico, a brief halt in Libyan oil exports, and rising Guyana volumes.

In 2025, suppliers will keep grappling with falling fuel demand in major consuming centers such as China. Also, more countries will use less oil and more gas, while renewable energy will keep growing. "This kind of uncertainty and volatility is the new normal - 2019 was the last 'normal' year," said Erik Broekhuizen, a marine research and consulting manager at ship brokering firm Poten & Partners.

FURTHER ROOM TO FALL

Changes in oil demand forecasts have pulled the rug out from historical long-term oil market growth assumptions, Broekhuizen said. "In the past, you could always say that there will be healthy long-term demand growth, and that solves a lot of problems over time. That can't really be taken for granted anymore," he said, citing weaker demand in China and Europe.

China's imports fell about 3% last year with gains in electric and plug-in hybrid cars, and growing use of liquefied in its heavy trucking. In Europe, lower refining capacity and government mandates to reduce carbon have shaved crude imports by about 1%.

NEW SUPPLIERS, NEW ROUTES

Europe's refiners initially cut Russian imports and increased both U.S. and Middle Eastern oil purchases after Russia invaded Ukraine. Attacks on ships in the Red Sea following Israel's war on Gaza pushed up the cost of shipping from the Middle East. Refiners stepped up imports from the U.S. and Guyana to record highs.

Exports from Iraq declined 82,000 bpd and United Arab Emirates exports fell 35,000 bpd in 2024. Europe added 162,000 bpd from Guyana and 60,000 bpd from the U.S. Escalating Middle East conflict around late September and fears of more sanctions from U.S. President-elect Donald Trump led to tighter supply and higher prices of Iranian oil. This prompted Chinese refiners to look at oil from West Africa and Brazil.

NEW REFINERIES, PIPELINES

Nigeria's new Dangote refinery consumed enough domestic supply to keep around 13% of Nigeria's crude exports in the country in 2024, up from 2% in 2023, according to Kpler. That cut Nigeria's exports to Europe, and Nigeria also imported 47,000 bpd of U.S. WTI, unusual for a major net exporter. New refining capacity ramping up in Bahrain, Oman and Iraq as well as Dos Bocas in Mexico are also likely to soak up oil production in those regions. In Canada, the expanded Trans Mountain pipeline can now ship an extra 590,000 bpd to the Pacific Coast, lifting the nation's waterborne exports to a record 550,000 bpd in 2024.

This has had a ripple effect: With increased Canadian crude flowing to the U.S. West Coast, refineries in the region bought less Saudi Arabian and Latin American crude, while direct shipments from Canada to Asian countries have cut re-exports from the U.S. Gulf Coast. While China has been Canada's major buyer, the crude has also found importers in India, Japan, South Korea and Brunei and more Asian refiners are likely to purchase the oil, analysts noted.

Trump's proposed 25% tariff on Canadian and Mexican crude, the top two foreign oil suppliers to the U.S., could also change oil flows in 2025, analysts said.

FINLAND SAYS OIL TANKER LINKED TO SUBSEA CABLE DAMAGE HAS SERIOUS DEFICIENCIES

inland's public transport agency said that an oil tanker suspected of damaging undersea cables in the Baltic Sea was found to have serious deficiencies and will not be allowed to operate until repairs have been made.

Baltic Sea nations are on high alert after a string of power cable, telecom link and gas pipeline outages since Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022. The NATO military alliance has said it will boost its presence in the region.

Finnish police on Dec. 26 seized the Eagle S tanker carrying Russian oil and said they suspected the vessel had damaged the Finnish-Estonian Estlink 2 power line and four telecoms cables by dragging its anchor across the seabed.

While the police investigation is ongoing, authorities also checked the vessel's condition in a port state inspection, and said that they found 32 errors, including in the fire safety, navigation equipment and pump room ventilation.

"Operating the ship is forbidden until the deficiencies have been rectified," Director of Maritime Affairs Sanna Sonninen at Finnish

Transport and Communications Agency Traficom said in a statement.

Correcting the deficiencies will require outside assistance and will take time, she added.

Finnish lawyer Herman Ljungberg, who represents the ship's owner, United Arab Emirates-based Caravella LLC FZ, said the inspector's findings should have first been delivered to the company and the vessel before being shared in public.

The lawyer has said that the ship's alleged damage to undersea equipment happened outside of Finland's territorial waters and that the country lacked jurisdiction to intervene.

A Finnish court denied a request for the vessel's release. Finnish police have said they ordered a travel ban for eight crew members as part of the investigation.

Finland's customs service has said it believes the Eagle S is part of a shadow fleet of tankers used to circumvent sanctions on Russian oil, and has impounded its cargo. Moscow has said Finland's seizure of the ship is not a matter for Russia.

US GAS-FIRED POWER BOOM REVEALS KEY EMISSIONS PAYOFF IN 2024

or the first time, over 1 billion metric tons of carbon dioxide (CO2) was discharged from U.S. gas-fired power stations in a single year during 2024, marking a new pollution threshold for the world's largest gas producer and consumer.

The 1.003 billion ton emissions figure is 3.6% up from 2023, and marks a 40% jump in gas-fired power generation emissions since 2015, according to data from Ember.

Those numbers look large, but lack important context. Discharge from the U.S. fleet of coal-fired power stations was just under 620 million tons last year, a record low due to the smallest coal-fired power generation level on record.

And as U.S. coal plants discharge 77% more CO2 per unit of electricity than gas-fired plants, the lower coal generation totals reveal that the U.S. power system has actually made steep cuts to overall pollution even as gas emissions have climbed.

COAL VS CLEAN

Thanks to the cuts to coal use, total U.S. power emissions from all fossil fuels were up only 0.5% in 2024 from 2023 to 1.64 billion tons, and were down 19% since 2015.

What's more, that emissions load has declined despite total electricity generation climbing to all-time highs in 2024.

A rapid climb in electricity generation from clean power – including from solar, wind, hydro and nuclear assets – has helped meet much of the rise in consumption in recent years.

Total clean electricity generation was 35% higher in 2024 than in 2015, thanks mainly to a nearly eightfold rise in solar generation and a more than doubling in output from wind farms during that period.

But fossil fuels remain the backbone of the U.S. generation system, supplying just over 58% of all electricity last year.

Natural gas accounted for a record 73% of that fossil share, while coal plants supplied the remaining 26% or so.

Power firms plan to make further cuts to coal use over the remainder of this decade, while adding more renewables to the generation mix to ensure total electricity supplies continue to climb in line with demand.

But power suppliers are also set to become even more reliant on natural gas, especially for system-balancing needs whenever intermittent output from renewable energy sources falls short of overall demand needs.

GAS FIX

Over 30 U.S. states rely on natural gas for 30% or more of their electricity needs, according to Ember.

Thirteen of those states rely on gas for 50% or more of their electricity, while an additional nine states use gas for between 15% and 30% of their electricity.

On top of that, nearly 50 gas-fired plants are in preconstruction or are under construction across the U.S., according to Global Energy Monitor, with a combined capacity of close to 30,000 megawatts.

That heavy reliance on legacy and new power plants and pipelines means that natural gas will remain integral to the U.S. power system for decades, even as renewable generation totals continue to climb.

That in turn means that overall emissions from natural gas use in the U.S. will also continue to climb.

But some of those gas plants will be used to replace retiring coal power stations, which on average have already been operating for 45 years according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration. That means even as more gas capacity comes on line, some of the highest-polluting U.S. coal plants will be shuttered over roughly the same period, which should help cap overall fossil fuel pollution even as the U.S. power system gets ever gassier.

MIDDLE EAST CRUDE-BENCHMARKS GAIN; OPEC OIL OUTPUT FALLS IN DECEMBER

iddle East crude benchmarks Oman, Dubai and Murban rose amid firm demand from Asia, and as OPEC oil output fell in December after two months of increases.

The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries pumped 26.46 million barrels per day in December, down 50,000 bpd from November, a Reuters survey showed, with the United Arab

Emirates providing the biggest drop.

The drop in the UAE's output was due to field maintenance, while Iran's production also declined, offseting a hike from Nigeria and other gains elsewhere in the group.

UNDERSTANDING MARPOL ANNEX I: REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF POLLUTION BY OIL

The International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL) is a cornerstone in international maritime law, designed to minimize pollution from ships globally. Annex I of MARPOL, the first and one of the most critical annexes, specifically addresses the prevention of pollution by oil. This article explores the key provisions, implementation mechanisms, challenges, and impact of MARPOL Annex I, providing a comprehensive understanding of its role in safeguarding marine environments.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT AND ADOPTION OF MARPOL ANNEXI

MARPOL was adopted in 1973 by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) and was later modified by the 1978 Protocol. Annex I, which entered into force on October 2, 1983, was the first annex to be implemented, reflecting the urgency of addressing oil pollution in marine environments.

Scope and Applicability

Annex I mandates specific design and construction standards to minimize the risk of oil pollution:

- Double Hull Requirements: Oil tankers must be constructed with double hulls to reduce the likelihood of oil leakage in the event of a hull breach.
- Segregated Ballast Tanks (SBTs): Ballast water must be carried in separate tanks to prevent contamination with oil cargo residues.

2. Operational Discharge Standards

Operational discharges of oil into the sea are strictly regulated under Annex I:

- Oil Content Limits: The oil content of discharged water must not exceed 15 parts per million (ppm).
- Oil Discharge Monitoring and Control Systems (ODMCS): Ships must be equipped with systems to monitor and control oil discharges, ensuring compliance with discharge standards.

3. Oil Record Book

Ships are required to maintain an Oil Record Book, documenting all oil-related operations, including:

- · Loading and unloading of oil cargo.
- · Ballasting and cleaning of oil tanks.
- · Disposal of oily residues and sludge.

This record serves as a critical tool for monitoring compliance and is subject to inspection by port state control authorities.

4. Emergency Preparedness and Response

Annex I emphasizes the importance of preparedness for oil spill incidents:

- Shipboard Oil Pollution Emergency Plan (SOPEP): All ships must have a SOPEP, outlining procedures for responding to oil spills and notifying authorities.
- National and Regional Contingency Plans: States are encouraged to develop and implement contingency plans for addressing large-scale oil spills.

IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT

The successful implementation of MARPOL Annex I relies on a combination of international, regional, and national efforts:

- Flag State Responsibility: Flag states are responsible for ensuring their ships comply with Annex I requirements, including certification and regular inspections.
- Port State Control (PSC): Port states have the authority to inspect foreign ships in their ports to verify compliance with Annex I.

• **Certification:** Ships must carry an International Oil Pollution Prevention (IOPP) Certificate, issued by their flag state, as evidence of compliance.

TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATIONS SUPPORTING ANNEX I COMPLIANCE

Advancements in technology have played a vital role in enhancing compliance with Annex I regulations:

- Bilge Water Treatment Systems: Modern ships are equipped with advanced systems to separate oil from bilge water, ensuring discharges meet the 15 ppm standard.
- Electronic Oil Record Books (e-ORB): The adoption of electronic record books improves accuracy and facilitates inspection processes.
- Satellite Monitoring: Satellite technology enables realtime monitoring of oil discharges, enhancing enforcement capabilities.

CHALLENGES IN IMPLEMENTATION

Despite its robust framework, the implementation of MARPOL Annex I faces several challenges:

- 1. Non-Compliance and Illegal Discharges: Some ships continue to discharge oil illegally, driven by economic incentives or lax enforcement.
- 2. Limited Resources for Port States: Developing countries often lack the resources to conduct thorough inspections and enforce compliance.

IMPACT OF MARPOL ANNEX I

Since its adoption, MARPOL Annex I has significantly reduced oil pollution from ships, contributing to the protection of marine ecosystems and coastal communities. Measures introduced by IMO have helped ensure that the majority of oil tankers are safely built and operated and are constructed to reduce the amount of oil spilled in the event of an accident. Operational pollution, such as from routine tank cleaning operations, has also been cut.

Key achievements include:

- Decline in Oil Spills: The number of major oil spills has decreased dramatically, thanks to stricter regulations and improved ship designs.
- Enhanced Awareness and Collaboration: Annex I has fostered greater awareness of oil pollution issues and encouraged international collaboration.
- Strengthened Legal Framework: It has provided a strong legal basis for prosecuting offenders and enforcing compliance.

FUTURE DIRECTIONS AND ENHANCEMENTS

To address emerging challenges and further enhance the effectiveness of MARPOL Annex I, the following measures are being considered:

- 1. Strengthening Enforcement Mechanisms: Enhancing port state control inspections and increasing penalties for non-compliance.
- 2. Promoting Technological Innovation: Encouraging the adoption of cutting-edge technologies to improve compliance and monitoring.
- 3. Capacity Building: Providing technical and financial assistance to developing countries to strengthen their enforcement capabilities.
- **4. Updating Standards:** Periodically reviewing and updating Annex I provisions to address new risks and challenges.

CONCLUSION

MARPOL Annex I represents a landmark effort to combat oil pollution and protect marine environments. Its comprehensive framework, encompassing prevention, preparedness, and response, has proven effective in reducing oil pollution and fostering sustainable maritime practices. However, continued vigilance, innovation, and international cooperation are essential to address the evolving challenges and ensure the long-term success of this critical environmental treaty. 



PM MODI LIKELY TO INAUGURATE Z - MORH TUNNEL ON LOHRI: RAILWAYS GEAR UP FOR TRAIN LINK TO VALLEY



In a big boost to connectivity in Kashmir, PM Narendra Modi is likely to inaugurate the 6.5-km Z-Morh road tunnel between Gagangir and Sonmarg in the Valley on Lohri (January 13) to make Sonamarg an all-weather tourist destination. The Indian Railways also successfully operated a train at 110 kmph on USBRL's Katra-Banihal section, paving the way for train operations between Katra and Srinagar.

Railway minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the final stage of inspection by the Commissioner of Railway Safety for the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) was conducted. He added that the specially designed Jammu-Srinagar Vande Bharat with eight coaches, equipped with antifreezing features, will be operational soon.

Sharing details of the Z-Morh tunnel project's inauguration, sources said the PM is scheduled to physically inaugurate the tunnel. At present, the Gagangir-Sonamarg stretch gets blocked by heavy snowfall and avalanches during winters. The two-lane tunnel will bring down travel time to barely 15 minutes, compared to hours taken by vehicles to cover the zig-zag road.

"Once the adjacent Zoji-La tunnel is completed, the travel between Srinagar and Leh will be seamless and will provide connectivity to Baltal (Amarnath cave shrine), Kargil and other places in the Ladakh region. It will also allow faster and smoother movement of military vehicles to the border.

Just when the Z-Morh tunnel was almost complete for opening, terrorists attacked the workers' camp at Gagangir last Oct. In the indiscriminate firing, seven civilians, including six non-local workers of the infrastructure company building the tunnel, were killed. "The project is now ready for inauguration and security issues have been addressed," a source said.

On the 272-km USBRL project, costing around Rs 40,000 crore, Vaishnaw said the government has given priority to safety before opening the rail link to Kashmir with the rest of the country. He said the redevelopment of the Jammu station will be complete by Aug and it will have eight platforms and modern amenities. "It was a very challenging project and the toughest challenge was to give foundation support to the world's highest arch bridge (359 m) on the Chenab river and country's longest transportation tunnel," he said.

Vaishnaw added that snow removal train, which will move ahead of passenger and freight trains, will make sure that services on this strategic route runs all through the year. The railways has also used anti-vibration seismic devices in the project as this region falls under Zone-V earthquake vulnerability. The dampers will absorb the tremors, and thus, maintain faster and safer travel.

INDIA, EU VOW TO PROTECT, PROMOTE HUMAN RIGHTS

India and the European Union (EU) agreed to safeguard the freedom, independence and diversity of civil society organisations and other stakeholders such as journalists as part of their shared commitment to uphold human rights.

The strengthening of national and international mechanisms to protect and promote human rights and the shared values of democracy, freedom and rule of law figured in the India-EU Human Rights Dialogue held in New Delhi. The two sides welcomed the "meaningful, free and frank discussions" under this framework, an Indian readout said.

"Reflecting their commitment to upholding human rights, they both agreed on the need to safeguard the freedom, independence and diversity of civil society actors and organisations and other relevant stakeholders such as journalists, respecting freedom of association, expression and peaceful assembly," the readout from the external affairs ministry said.

India and the EU also reiterated their commitment to the "shared principles and values of democracy, freedom, rule of law, and to the promotion and protection of all human rights", the readout said.

Both sides pointed to the "importance of strengthening national and international human rights mechanisms" to protect and promote human rights, and underlined the need to enhance cooperation in multilateral forums such as the UN General Assembly and the UN Human Rights Council (UNHRC). They committed themselves to closer cooperation and regular exchanges between the permanent missions of India and the EU in Geneva to identify "further opportunities for joint action".

The EU reiterated its opposition to capital punishment, while India reiterated its stand on recognition of the Right to Development as a universal and fundamental human right. Both sides also discussed issues related to civil and political rights, social, economic and cultural rights, elimination of all forms of discrimination, freedom of religion or belief, countering religious hatred, freedom of expression and opinion, both online and offline, gender, LGBTQI+ and rights of children, women's empowerment, and technology and human rights.

They also exchanged views on the rights of migrants and business and human rights, and discussed cooperation on humanitarian assistance and disaster relief in line with international humanitarian law.

The dialogue was last held in July 2022 and the two sides outlined their approaches, achievements and challenges while moving towards the shared goal of advancing all human rights. The dialogue was co-chaired by Piyush Srivastava, joint secretary (Europe West) in the external affairs ministry, and EU ambassador Hervé Delphin.

RS 55.000-CRORE VANDE BHARAT SLEEPER MANUFACTURE PLANS BACK ON TRACK AS GOVERNMENT OKAYS ORIGINALS DESIGN OF COACHES

The issue of four toilets instead of three in each coach of Vande Bharat sleeper trains and a pantry car in every trainset, which had held up the Rs 55,000 crore project, has been resolved, railway minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said. He said they will go with the original design of coaches with three toilets and no pantry car in each train since these are meant for overnight journeys.

Kinet Railway Solutions, the SPV of Russian railway major TMH and Indian Railways' PSU, RVNL, which has bagged a contract to manufacture 1,920 sleeper coaches or 80 trainsets, had raised concern over the change in design and had sought a higher price. "Since there is no change in the original design, there is no need for revising the cost," Vaishnaw said.

Sources said the railway board had informed their decision to Kinet Railway Solutions in the last week of December. Besides Kinet, the railways has awarded a consortium of Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) and Titagarh Rail Systems (TRS) the contract to manufacture 1,280 coaches or 53 trainsets. Moreover, a contract for supply of 10 Vande Sleeper trains has been awarded to BEML and Integral Coach Factory (ICF), Chennai on nomination basis.

On the issue of concerns regarding procurement of bullet trains from Japan, officials said all issues have been resolved and India will get Shinkansen E5 bullet trains to ply on the Mumbai-Ahmedabad corridor. "We will get the train with the best available technology. Techniques for developing bullet train infrastructure are being indigenised and those will be used in future projects," an official said.

He added that Japanese counterparts have appreciated the good progress made in India and the technology for launching 40-metre girders for bullet train projects and they will import this from India.

JOE BIDEN CANCELS FINAL TRIP TO ITALY AS US PRESIDENT TO TACKLE CALIFORNIA FIRES

S President, Joe Biden canceled his trip to Rome, Italy, and Vatican City to address the devastating wildfires in California. He had been scheduled to depart after attending a memorial service for former US President, Jimmy Carter.

Wildfires in Los Angeles have claimed at least five lives and forced thousands to evacuate. Over 1,000 buildings, including homes, businesses, and landmarks, have been destroyed.

White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said that the president decided to cancel his upcoming trip to Italy to focus on directing the federal response to the wildfires.

"After returning this evening from Los Angeles, where earlier today he had met with police, fire, and emergency personnel fighting the historic fires raging in the area and approved a Major Disaster declaration for California, President Biden made the decision to cancel his upcoming trip to Italy to remain focused on directing the full federal response in the days ahead," said Jean-Pierre.

The trip was seen as a significant event for Biden's presidency, offering a chance to emphasise American alliances. The three-day trip would have included meetings with Pope Francis, Italian President Sergio Mattarella, and Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni.

Biden returned to Washington from Los Angeles evening after meeting his first great-grandchild and receiving a briefing on the fires.

'Southern California, we are with you'.

Biden expressed federal support for California in a post on the social media platform X. B "I've just received a briefing from @FEMA Administrator Criswell and my Homeland Security Advisor, Liz Sherwood-Randall, on the latest around our federal response to the wildfires across Los Angeles. Southern California, we are with you. And we're not letting up," he said.

Biden also approved California governor Gavin Newsom's request for a major disaster declaration.

"I've approved Governor Newsom's request for a major disaster declaration and ordered Federal assistance to supplement response efforts in areas affected by wildfires, ensuring impacted communities and survivors have immediate access to funds and resources to begin their recovery," the president said in another post.

Biden shows support for firefighters

Biden expressed his support for firefighters working to save lives amid the wildfires.

"To the brave men and women who ran towards danger over the past 24 hours in Southern California, I want you to know your President, and the rest of the country, is with you. You suited up and risked your lives to save the lives of your fellow Americans. We are indebted to you," he said in another post.

GOVT PROBING IF STARLINK USED IN MANIPUR

entral agencies are conducting a probe to check the potential usage of Starlink internet services in Manipur after security forces recovered an antenna and router in the strife-torn state last month, officials aware of the matter said.

Officials said that a team of Assam Rifles personnel seized the devices in Imphal East district of the state on December 13 during a search and cordon operation at a camp operated by the militant group People's Liberation Army (PLA). An official aware of the development said that a team of experts from Delhi, accompanied by the Manipur Police, took the recovered satellite devices to the spot where they were found to test if they worked.

"The device was recovered from the Imphal East hideout of a militant camp," the official cited above said on condition of anonymity. "The experts from New Delhi have confirmed that the device did not work in that spot (during testing) or any other area in Imphal. But, they are conducting tests in the fringe areas of the state before completing their probe."

SpaceX founder Elon Musk has also dismissed reports of the internet service being available in India. "Starlink satellite beams are turned off over India," he had said on December 17 in response to a question raised by an X user over the alleged usage of the technology in Manipur.

Security forces suspect the recovered devices may have been smuggled from Myanmar.

They said that if militant groups are using Starlink, then it could pose a challenge as it allows them to easily communicate with their cadres from remote areas without being traced.

Both Manipur police and the state government did not comment on the probe.

US TO ANNOUNCE NEW WEAPONS PACKAGE FOR UKRAINE AS DEFENSE LEADERS PREPARE TO MEET IN GERMANY

he U.S. is expected to announce \$500 million in military aid for Ukraine at a final gathering of President, Joe Biden's weapons pledging conferences, meetings Kyiv says have been critical to its defense against Russia.

The Ukraine Defense Contact Group, comprised of about 50 allies who usually meet every few months at Ramstein Air Base in Germany, was started in 2022 by U.S. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin to speed and synchronize the delivery of arms to Kyiv.

The group's future is unclear with President-elect Donald Trump set to take office on Jan 20. Advisers to Trump have floated proposals to end the Ukraine war that would cede large parts of the country to Russia for the foreseeable future.

Washington has committed more than \$63.5 billion in security assistance to Ukraine since Russia's invasion and the additional \$500 million could be announced later, a U.S. official said, speaking on the condition of anonymity.

The defense leaders will meet at Ramstein Air Base for the 25th UDCG meeting.

"We're not sunsetting the group. The next administration is completely welcome and encouraged ... to take the mantle of this 50 country strong group and continue to drive and lead through it," said a senior U.S. defense official, speaking on the condition of anonymity.

"It will endure in some capacity, in some form going forward, I believe, regardless of exactly how the next team does or doesn't pursue it," the official said.

The official added that the meeting would look to endorse roadmaps for Ukraine's military needs and objectives through 2027. More than 12,300 civilians have been killed in the Ukraine war since Russia invaded nearly three years ago, the United Nations said, noting a spike in casualties due to the use of drones, long-range missiles and glide bombs.

Ukraine said its forces were "commencing new offensive actions" in Russia's western Kursk region.

Ukraine first seized part of the Kursk region in a surprise incursion last August, and it has held territory there for five months despite losing some ground.

The apparent escalation in the fighting in the Kursk region comes at a critical time for Ukraine, whose outnumbered and outgunned troops are struggling to repel Russian advances in the east.

IMD MARKS 150 YEARS: CENTRE INVITES PAKISTAN, BANGLADESH AND OTHER NATIONS FROM 'UNDIVIDED INDIA' TO JOIN CELEBRATIONS

he government has extended invitations to officials from countries that were part of undivided India at the time to mark 150 years of the India Meteorological Department, established in 1875. This includes officials from Pakistan, Afghanistan, Myanmar, Bhutan, Maldives, Sri Lanka, and Nepal.

Representatives from the Middle East and Southwest Asia have also been invited to join the celebrations. Pakistan has confirmed its participation, while the IMD awaits confirmation from Bangladesh.

A senior IMD official said, "We wanted officials from all countries that were part of undivided India during IMD's establishment to be part of the celebrations."

The celebrations will include a variety of events such as marathons, exhibitions, workshops, and olympiads. To commemorate the occasion, the finance ministry has also approved a special Rs 150 commemorative coin.

Adding to the festivities, the IMD will showcase its first-ever tableau during the Republic Day parade, highlighting its legacy and contributions to meteorology.

Born out of necessity during the British era after the devastating Calcutta cyclone of 1864 and multiple monsoon failures, the IMD began as modest weather forecasting entity. Over 150 years, it has grown into a global leader in meteorological research, weather communication, and forecasting.

In its early years, the IMD used telegrams to send weather warnings. Over time, it embraced cutting- edge technology, pioneering the use of electronic computers for meteorological research and introducing India's first message-switching computer for global data exchange.

India also made history as the first developing country to launch its geostationary satellite, INSAT, enabling roundthe-clock weather monitoring and cyclone alerts.

JUSTIN TRUDEAU STEPS DOWN AS CANADA PM

Justin Trudeau announced that he is resigning as the prime minister of Canada and as the leader of his governing Liberal Party, marking the end of his nine-year-long tenure.

The 53-year-old Justin Trudeau is the longest-serving leader of any of the Group of Seven (G7) countries.

He said that Canadians deserve a "real choice" in the next election and that he cannot be the one to carry the Liberal standard into the next election.

Trudeau's ground on Canadian politics has been shaky for months now, with the public outraged over high prices, interest rates and a housing shortage.

"My friends, as you all know, I'm a fighter. Every bone in my body has all told me to fight because I care deeply about Canadians. I care deeply about this country, and I will always be motivated by what is in the best interest of Canadians," Trudeau said.

After the party selects its next leader through a robust, nationwide competitive process, "I intend to resign as party leader, as Prime Minister," he added.

After announcing his exit, Trudeau mentioned "one regret" that he has from his tenure at the office. He said, "If I have one regret, particularly as we approach this election, well probably many regrets that I will think of.

But I do wish we'd been able to change the way we elect our governments in this country so that people could simply choose a second choice, or a third choice on the same ballot."

In his announcement, he also highlighted that the Canadian Parliament has been paralysed for months despite the best efforts being made towards the people.



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
